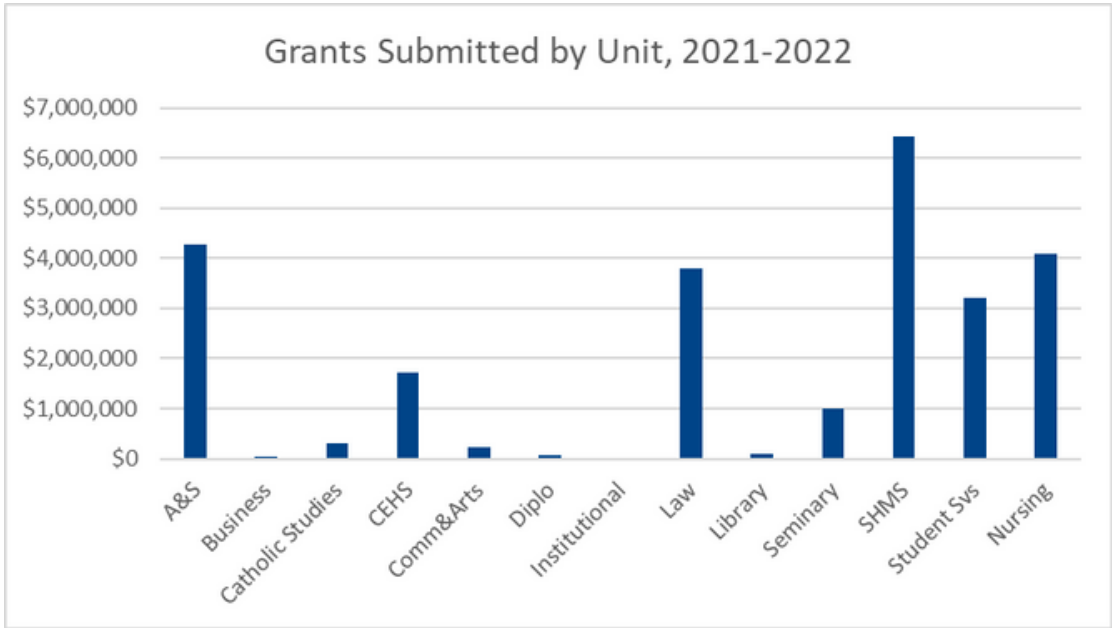


Grant Submissions

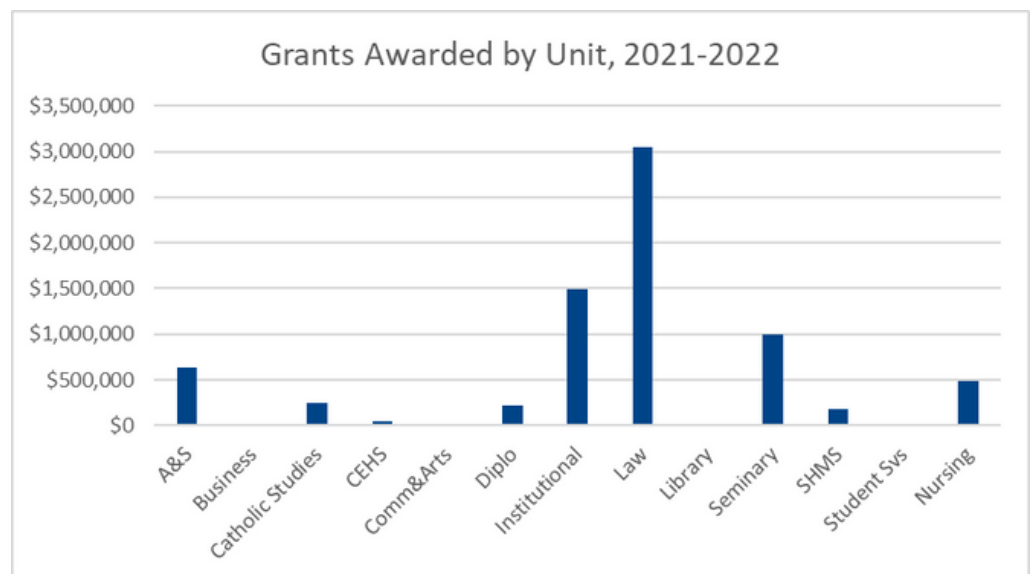

\$180,000 awarded by the New Jersey Commission on Brain Injury Research (NJCBIR) for their pioneering interdisciplinary project "Speech Indicators of Dysfunction and Recovery following Mild Traumatic Brain Injury" in collaboration with Director of Sports Medicine Anthony J. Testa, the University athletic trainers team, and Dr. Felicia Glicksman, Director of the Concussion Center at the Hackensack University Medical Center

\$248,469 awarded by the Porticus Foundation in support of current programming and relationship building with faculty, Catholic Studies, the local church and community, and partners in mission across the country, contributing to the Center's mission in preserving, communicating, and strengthening the Catholic identity of Seton Hall.

Joseph Huddleston Assistant Professor in the School of Diplomacy and International Relations

\$20,000 awarded by the Carolyn Jane Scott Charitable Trust in support of undergraduate research conducted through the DiploLab. Founded in 2019, the DiploLab is a collaborative research space where Diplomacy students can explore their scholarly interests related to international relations, engage with faculty, and apply classroom learning.

Jessica Cottrell Associate Professor of Biological Sciences, Department of Biological Sciences

\$10,000 awarded by the University Research Council in support of her work to expand bone research initiatives into medicinal chemistry and environmental sciences. Her research on vancomycin and diabetic fracture healing won the J. Leonard Goldner Award, given by the American Orthopedic Foot and Ankle Society in recognition of outstanding basic science in September 2021.

eRepository

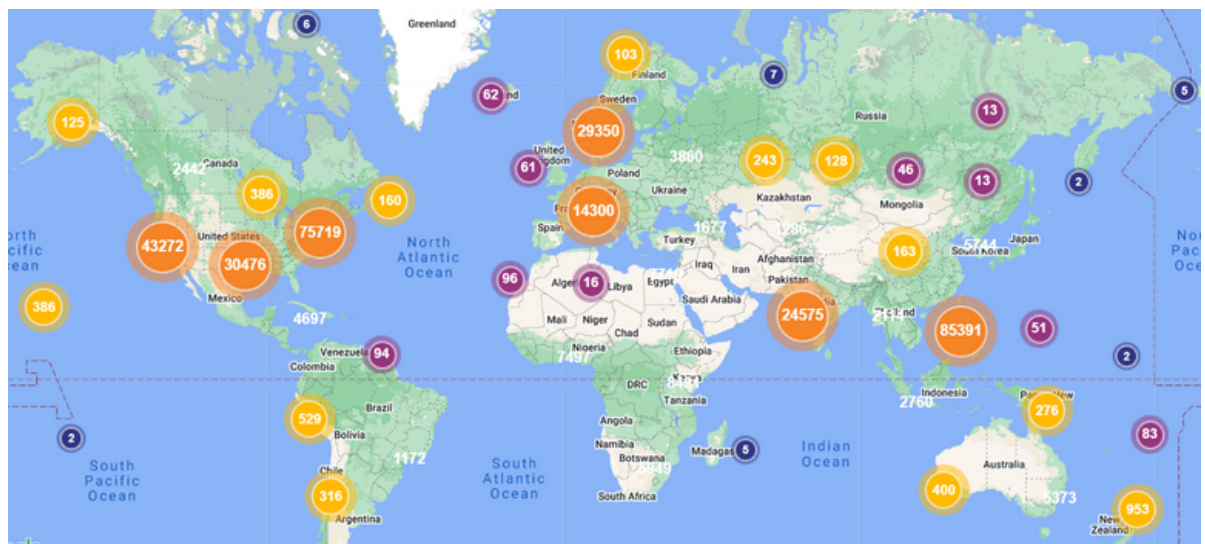
The Seton Hall Institutional Repository or eRepository is a publisher and archive of scholarly works managed by SHU Libraries and the Seton Hall Law School. The repository houses faculty profiles, electronic journals, theses & dissertations, and other scholarly content.

100 theses and dissertations (ETDs) were uploaded to the institutional repository in the 2021-2022 academic year, representing a **4.53%** increase, bringing the total to **2,307**.

The repositories holdings were viewed in **222** countries and downloaded by **17,385** educational, commercial, and governmental institutions.
