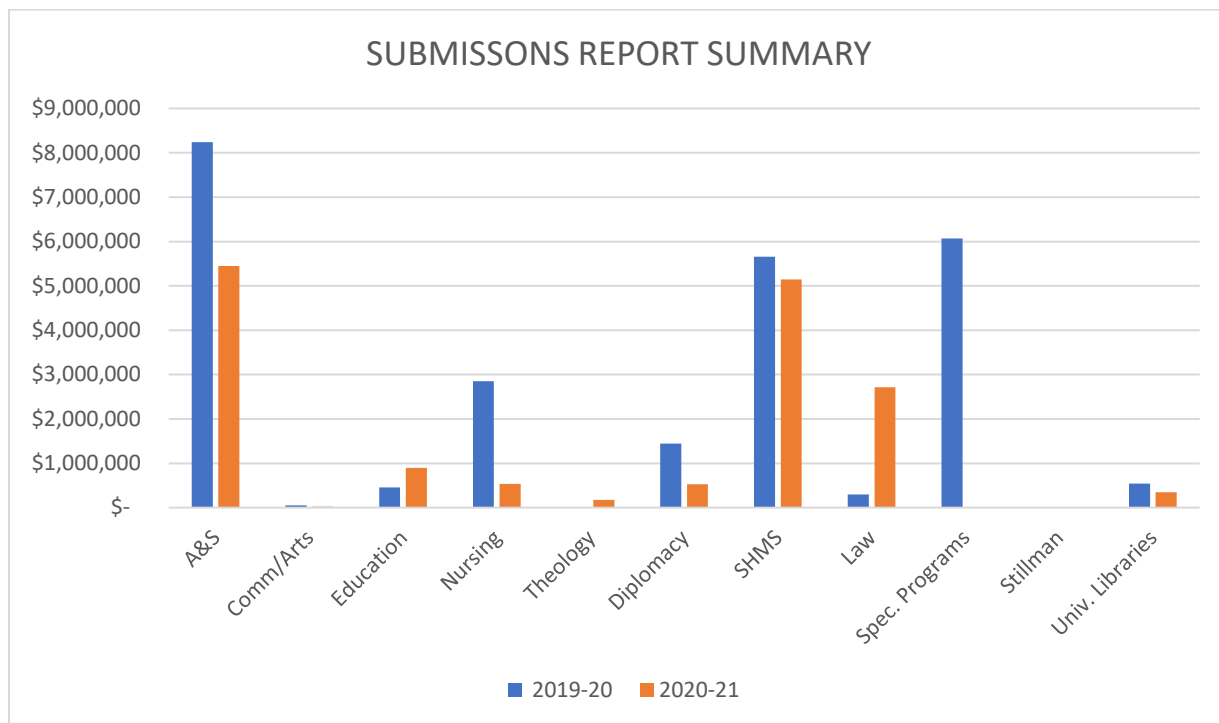

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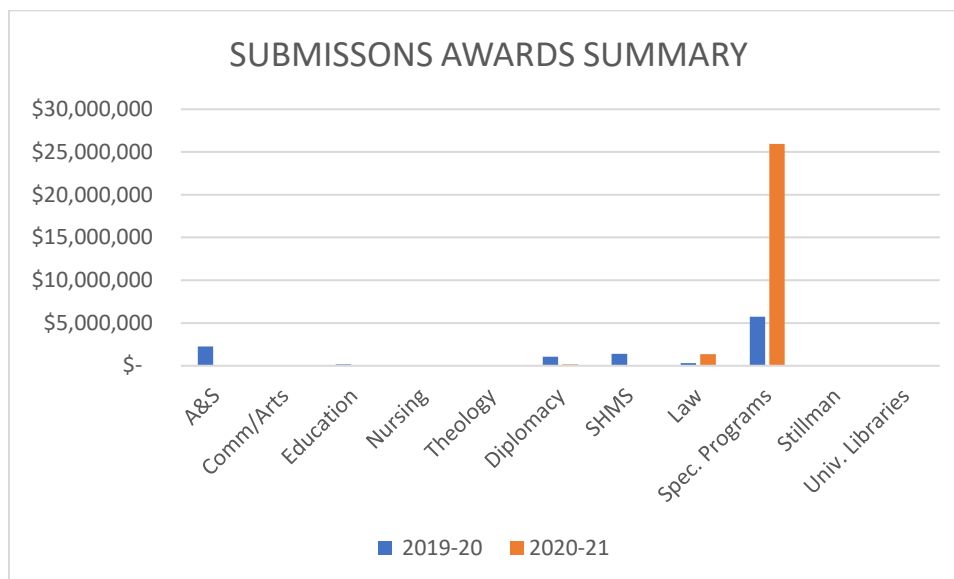

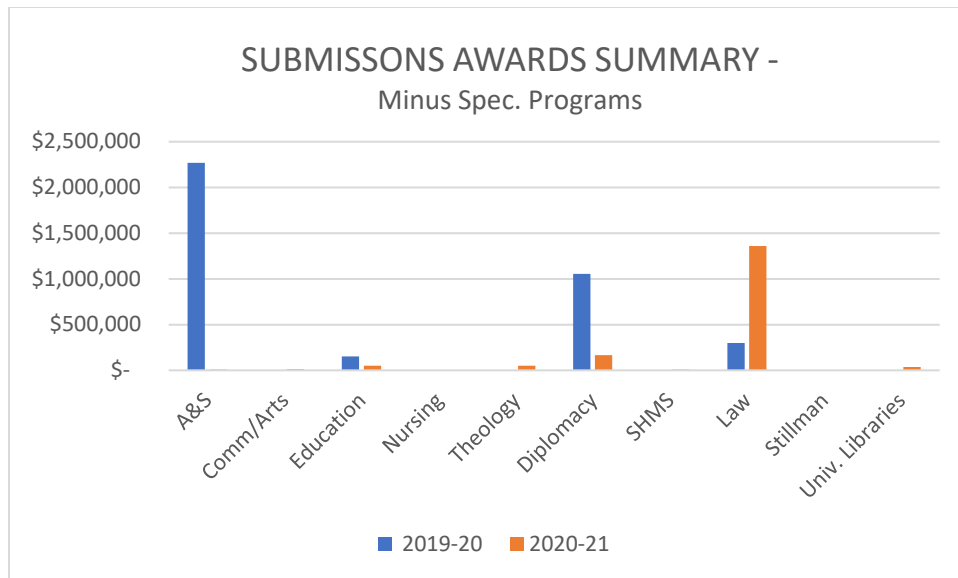

Special Programs – all government relief



Since coming on board January 11, 2021 as Interim Associate Provost for Research and Innovation – and in light of the data reported above, our collective efforts in the Office of Grants and Research, my role, and with help from University Libraries’ faculty and administrators have focused on, in priority order:

1. Cayuse Implementation. Cayuse was selected, the price negotiated down some, contract signed. Coordination with SHU IT established, and implementation begun starting in February. Security standards, data loads, budget/reporting structures and form design have been the agendas. We are on schedule for an August rollout so far. Human Ethics (IRB) and Post Award modules are next up.
2. Proposed and completed hiring of Compliance/Grants Generalist position, start date 9/1/21. Ms. Norma Rubio will help w/Cayuse Human Ethics implementation before that date. The goal is to leverage her extensive experience to help us well beyond compliance – and to tighten up our compliance processes.
3. Scry (A-I driven grant alert software platform). Vendor selected, the price negotiated down some, contract signed. Implementation begun with initial meeting.
4. Redesign of a Research and OGRS webpage. M. Hyland created a separate Research page on his own, but close to a mockup design done by a Library web team. EAB was engaged in a review to adapt the new page, combine with the old OGRS page, get editing rights for my team
5. IP Policy. Reviewed SHU drafts (2012-2013) against St. John’s IP policy along with Faculty Guide language on IP for a possible fast lane to a policy.
