Joan Bel Geddes is a former editor of several women's magazines. Together with her husband, Barry Ulanov, she translated *The Last Essays of Georges Bernanos*.

Father Myles M. Bourke, S.T.D., S.S.L., Professor of Sacred Scripture at St. Joseph's Seminary, Dunwoodie, New York, is chairman of the board of translators appointed by the Episcopal Committee of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine to prepare a new rendering of the New Testament.

Father Edward H. Flannery, who studied theology in Paris, is the editor of the *Providence Visitor*, of the diocese of Providence, Rhode Island. He translated Jacques Maritain's *Essay on Christian Philosophy* and *Words of Faith* by François Mauriac.

Father Bertram Hessler, O.F.M., S.T.D., S.S.L., is Lector at John Duns Scotus Academy in Mönchengladbach, Germany. His essays on biblical theology have appeared in Catholic journals, notably in *Wissenschaft und Weisheit* and *Antonianum*.
