The Walsh Gallery at Seton Hall University is pleased to announce an exhibition of installation art to be on display in the arcade windows along the perimeter of the Walsh Library. This invitational exhibition features artists Gianluca Bianchino, Evonne Davis, Asha Ganpat, Beth Gilfilen, Ryan Higgins and Nyugen Smith. Each of the six artists will create site-specific artworks which will be on display 24 hours, 7 days a week for the duration of the exhibition.

“windows@walsh” was organized by Gallery Director, Jeanne Brasile. Noted Brasile, “This exhibition will extend the presence of art outside the confines of the Walsh Gallery, allowing accidental encounters with art in a non-traditional setting.” The windows are similar to storefront windows, challenging the artists to create work in a space that is roughly 87” high, 95” wide and 29” deep. The artists will work in a variety of media to communicate their ideas to the public. This is the first time that the library windows have been used for such an event. Brasile hopes that this exhibition will become an annual one, providing exposure for local artists, while enriching the campus with additional venues to view art. The exhibition is free and open to the public.
