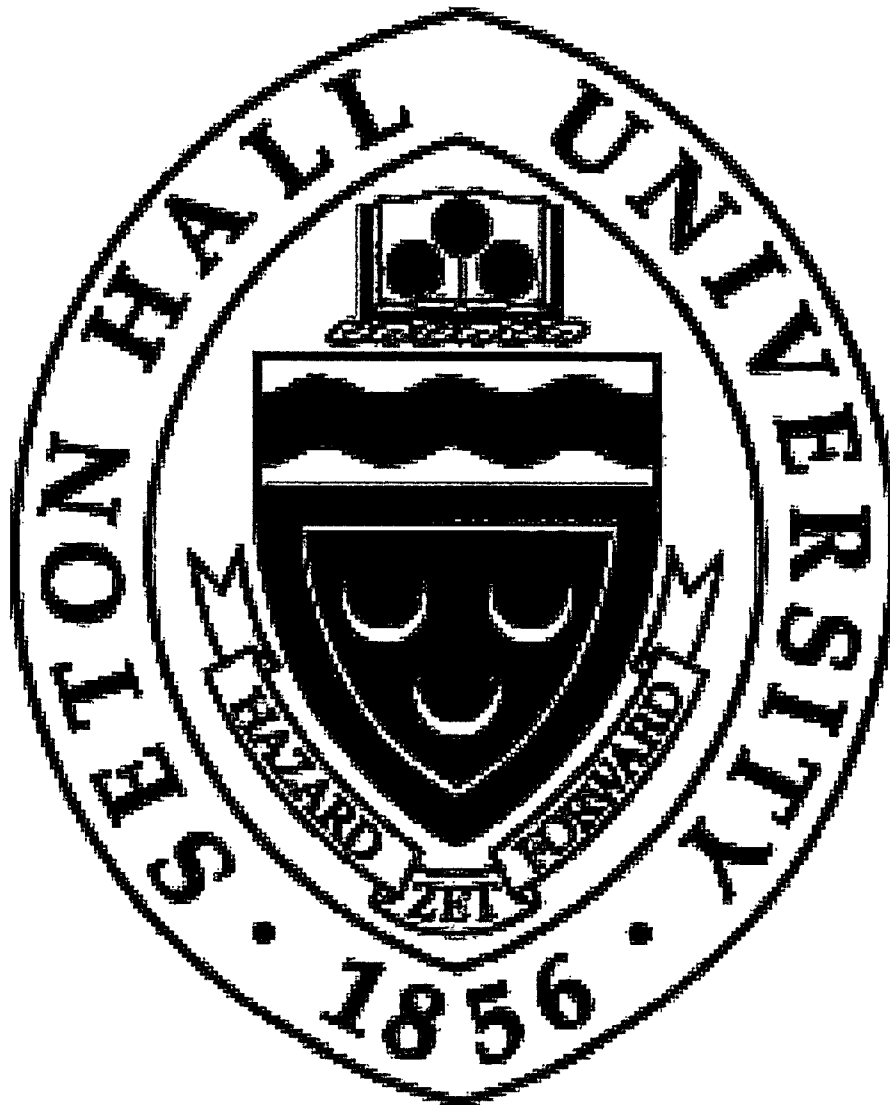

The Department of Political Science and Public Affairs offers a wide range of academic programs. Political science majors pursue a liberal arts curriculum that focuses on United States politics, comparative politics, international relations, political philosophy, and methodology. Undergraduate political science students at Seton Hall have the opportunity to complete internships with numerous public and private institutions for academic credit. In partnership with The Washington Center, the department offers students an opportunity to complete internships and coursework in Washington D.C. The political science program prepares students for graduate education and for careers in politics, law, government service, journalism, the nonprofit sector, public affairs, the private sector, and numerous other fields.

At the graduate level, the department offers a Masters in Public Administration (MPA) and a Masters in Healthcare Administration (MHA). The MPA program is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration (NASPAA). Students in the MPA program choose one of three concentrations: Nonprofit Organization Management, Public Service, or Healthcare Policy and Management. The MPA program in Nonprofit Organization Management is ranked #14 in the country by U.S. News and World Report.
