XAVIER CENTER
on the Campus of the College of St. Elizabeth

1. From NW New Jersey & NE Pennsylvania via Interstate 80

Take I-80 East to I-287 South. Proceed on 287 South to exit 35 (Madison Avenue, Old Route 24). At top of exit ramp, turn left. Proceed on Madison Avenue staying in right lane past Friendly's Restaurant, to the 5th traffic light (1.6 miles). **Landmark:** Rod's 1890's Restaurant and Madison Hotel on your left. Turn left at light, Convent Road. Proceed across RR tracks onto the campus of the College of St. Elizabeth; follow signs for Xavier Center. Parking Lot is beyond building on the left.

2. From W New Jersey & Pennsylvania via Interstate 78

Take I-78 East to I-287 North. Proceed to first Morristown exit 35 (South Street, Old Route 24). At end of ramp (traffic light), turn left. Proceed 100 yards ahead and take first right (following signs to Madison Avenue [Old Route 24]). At the stop sign, turn right, and proceed to the 5th traffic light (1.6 miles [stay in right lane past Friendly's Restaurant]). **Landmark:** Rod's 1890's Restaurant and Madison Hotel on your left. Turn left at light, Convent Road. Proceed across RR tracks onto campus of College of St. Elizabeth; follow signs for Xavier Center. Parking Lot is beyond building on the left.

3. From S New Jersey via NJ Turnpike

Take NJ Turnpike to exit 10 and follow I-287 North. Follow #2 above.

4. From N New Jersey and Upstate New York (Tappan Zee Bridge)

Take Garden State Parkway South to I-80 West (exit 159). Take I-80 West to I-287 South (Morristown exit). On I-287 South, follow #1 above.

5. From E New Jersey & New York (Lincoln & Holland Tunnels)

Follow signs to NJ Turnpike South. Take NJ Turnpike to exit 14 (Newark Airport). Take I-78 West to Route 24 (exit 48, Springfield & Morristown). Continue on Route 24 to exit 2A (Morristown, 510 West). As you leave the ramp, move into left lane; make a left at first light (Park Avenue), proceed past second traffic light, and make a right at sign for St. Elizabeth's. Parking lot is on your right before you reach building. Xavier Center is further up hill on your left.
